6/2/2026	Webinar 3A 4 - 5:00 pm	<b>Effective Use of Antibiotics</b>	Lynn Hovda, RPH, DVM, MS, DACVIM, Rick Arthur, DVM	The day-to-day responsibilities of the regulatory veterinarian involve oversight of the health, welfare, and safety of the race horse. With a focus on the safety of the equine athlete, it's important to remember that the systemic health of the horse is key to optimal performance. Because of the stressful environments these horses, especially young horses, are subjected to, and the likelihood of developing conditions which require treatment, judicious use of antibiotics is an important tool for the practicing veterinarian. In this session Drs. Hovda and Arthur will review principles of the effective use of antibiotics.

6/2/2026	Webinar 3B 5 - 6:00 pm	<b>Review and Comparison of Injuries in Racing between Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses</b>	Sue Stover, DVM, DACVS, PhD	Dr. Stover will provide a review of common race horse injuries with a comparison among race breeds, specifically the Quarter Horse and Thoroughbred. A more clear understanding of differences in racing and training styles between race breeds will benefit the regulatory veterinarian in determining at risk horses.
7/7/2026	Webinar 4A 4 - 5:00 pm	<b>Out of Competition Exams</b>	Laurie Bohannon, DVM; Tim Grande, DVM, MPH	Drs. Bohannon and Grande will provide an overview of the opportunities for regulatory veterinarian oversight of a resident population of horses within a racing or training facility. They will discuss out-of-competition-exams, requirements for pre-work exams and how these are accomplished, monitoring veterinary exams, layoff exams, utilization of risk assessment reports, designation of risk, and selection of horses to examine in consideration of staff limitations.
7/7/2026	Webinar 4B 5 - 6:00 pm	<b>Soundness Assessment: Case Videos</b>	Michael Hardy, DVM (Moderator)	Dr. Hardy will moderate a discussion where participants review videos of horses in motion, consider patient histories, and render assessments for fitness to race, or requirements for expanded evaluation of racehorses demonstrating gait abnormalities. The goal of this exercise is to promote consistency in clinical assessment and determination of a horse's fitness to race, as well as establishing criteria for allowing a horse to regain eligibility to race after a diagnosis of injury or unsoundness.
8/4/2026	Webinar 5A 4 - 5:00 pm	<b>Joint Development and Homeostasis - what matters in clinical practice?</b>	Bruno Menarim, DVM, PhD	Dr. Menarim will provide an overview of his lab's research covering musculoskeletal conditions in the horse with a focus on orthopedic immunology, primarily on mechanisms of synovial inflammation, with emphasis on endogenous mechanisms of inflammation resolution as pro-resolving therapeutics.

She will address how a regulatory veterinarian goes about identifying the index case, exposed horses, setting a perimeter/quarantine, establishing biosecurity measures and traffic flow, and determining appropriate diagnostics to assess risk and provide guidance as to how the track should move forward also while minimizing interruptions to everyday racing and training
